Focusing on love is a great thing any time of the year, but February seems to be an especially apt time. Of course, this is due to the scheduling of Valentine's Day, which society has expanded way beyond the feast of St. Valentine. The world seems to be always taking church things and making them into something else (although it's hard to be mad about something that involves chocolate and roses). And it is never a bad thing to prioritize love. I would just like to celebrate love in many different forms and not just that of romantic relationships. Love is so much bigger than that!

The world wants Valentine's Day to be about romance, but it started out as a feast day of an early church martyr, who wrote letters of encouragement to other Christians afraid for their lives. He would write notes reminding people that God loves them. In this day and age, none of us have to fear being literally fed to lions like the early Christians, but I know that many of us are going through some tough things. And whereas romance can be nice, I think the challenges of our world require something more. We need love in Godly proportions.

The bible is actually full of beautiful passages on love. Passages that can remind us of God's love and passages that encourage us to love others. In fact, there are more than enough to read verses every single day in February. They are included below, but I will also post them on our church Facebook page. Then you could share them to your own pages and spread the love of God to all your friends and family. Maybe this month, the love of God could go viral instead of misinformation, hateful speech, and toxicity.

If you don't do Facebook (or even if you do), you can also make traditional Valentine's Day cards using the bible verses and your own words of encouragement. Send them to your kids, grandkids, friends, pastor , or anyone else you care about!



Over the past few months, three Scouts from Troop 107 have completed Eagle Scout projects at St. Timothy Church.



Ryan Bedi built three outdoor bulletin boards for



the Church. The boards allow the Church, as well as any groups that are hosted at the Church, to post items such as posters, notices, events, and more. Each box is built to last; they are made of composite PVC wood and are lined with weather proofing.

Each also includes a lock and key to protect the contents of the box.

William Koppenal restored the playground area behind the parking lot. To make the space more usable, he built, sanded, and stained two benches and one picnic table to allow parishioners and Sunday School students to sit and enjoy the space. He also cleaned the entire fence, fixed all



the broken slats, put down mulch around the playground area and cleaned the playground equipment.

Matteo Dugdale restored the walking trail behind the church and



added a seating area with three benches so members of the Church can sit back and enjoy nature after Church. The original sitting and platform area has also been cleared away and connected to the new trail to allow for additional

seating and enjoyment.

All the Scouts would like to thank Pastor Kimberly and the Church Council for working with them to develop and approve their projects as they look to achieve Eagle Scout, the highest honor in the Scouting ranks.



While at the church we gathered a fleece jacket, a pair of insulated boots, heavy winter socks, protein bars and hand-warmers to take back to Mike. Again he was grateful, noting that these things would help keep him warm.

Your donations of used clothing and boots, your monetary donations, many in memory of loved ones, all allowed us to help a person in his time of need in our own community. We often say the Lord works in mysterious ways, but His ways aren't really mysterious after all. Thank you again for helping us provide comfort and care where it is needed.






